Active reading takes more time. Make sure to leave enough time for students to truly engage with the text. Choose one or two active reading strategies and use them early and often. When students are familiar with the routines, they will get more out of them. Use the same reading strategies across subject areas – they are not limited to science.

7 Active Reading Strategies for Students

Teach middle schoolers good note-taking practices by modeling a T-chart. Start by identifying the title of the article and adding it to the chart after the "T =" symbol. Then, read the next two sentences and zero in on a specific idea from the passage (in this case, one idea would be climate extremes). Demonstrate writing the specific idea (climate extremes) in the T-chart, next to the key symbol.
